### Overview of Homelessness in the United States

As of 2022, 582,462 people are homeless with 127,768 chronically homeless

Primary social determinants of housing insecurity are poverty, unemployment, and lack of affordable housing

In 2022, **21%** of individuals experiencing homelessness reported having a serious mental illness











## What is Housing First?

### **Brief History**

- Started in 1992 as Pathways to Housing
- The program model views housing as the main foundation for the improvement of life

3 Main Principles: permanent housing support, provide robust resources/services, and be client driven

 Clients are not required to address all issues prior to housing

### **Resources Offered**

The most successful strategy is to direct clients towards resources that are flexible and niche to the person and will assist the person the most - BE CREATIVE!

# City Level : Milwaukee County Housing Services

#### Model

Housing First program is operated through Milwaukee
County Housing Services and is led by the Housing First
Resident Advisory Council comprised of both clients and
staff to continuously improve care

### **Key Principles**

Clients dictate treatment stages while still receiving rental assistance and without needing to worry about status of billing

#### **Funding Sources**

Funding made possible through local tax levies and community contributions





#### **Community Partners**


County level legal and police departments, Department of Transportation, local parks, health systems, universities, and furniture banks

### Results



Homelessness has effectively been decriminalized as more individuals reach out to housing first instead of law enforcement

Time spent in the shelter has reduced by **72%** 



Reduced
Medicare costs
by **\$2.1 million**per year

Reduced mental health costs by **\$715K** per year



Reduced costs to legal system by **\$600K** per year

No unsheltered families for about 3 years

# State Level: Georgia Housing Voucher Program

### Model

Born out of 2008 Olmstead Settlement Agreement to expand alternatives to institutionalization for individuals with disabilities the program provides permanent supportive housing to individuals living with a psychiatric disability who are experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk and is operated through Georgia Department of Behavioral Health & Developmental Disabilities (DBHDD)

### **Primary Domains of Services**

Outreach, assessment, application, housing search, leasing, stability

### **Client Eligibility**

Must have diagnosis of serious mental illness (SMI) and be experiencing homelessness or enrolled in a residential program

Client is not required to pay more than 30% of income but there is capacity for individuals with no income

Individuals **do** need to be approved for Medicaid

### **Results**




Attempting to connect provider EMRs and statewide HMIs to the state's health information exchange to facilitate whole-person care

Since implemented in 2019, 2200 clients have been served



Large spikes in referral numbers now that the support system is in place with no waitlist currently




# Federal Level: HUD-VASH - Veteran's Affairs (VA) Model

#### Model

Although not a comprehensive Housing First model the HUD-VASH housing assistance uses its **key principles** to move veterans and their families into permanent housing and promote an independent transition

Comprehensive services are delivered through local VA medical centers

VA provides clinical case management model for veterans to obtain and maintain housing where



### Results



3 states and 83 cities have effectively ended veteran's homelessness with rates at a functional 0



# Functional Zero

The number of people who are homeless flow in and out but overall burden has reduced



# Increase in Funding

Federal funding for 2023 is about **\$94.4 million** to support approximately **11,000** new vouchers

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
