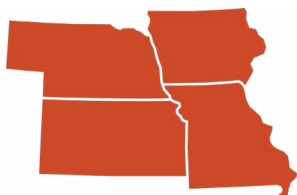


# Mid-America Crisis Planning Learning Community

The Mid-America MHTTC invites districts and/or building level crisis teams to participate in a one-year **regional peer learning community** focused on assessing current crisis response plans and implementing best practices in school crisis prevention and intervention efforts.

Teams selected to participate in the Learning Community will work toward the common mission of meeting student and staff mental health needs during crises and adopting policies and procedures to mitigate the crisis experience and facilitate evidence-based responses.

## Eligibility

Applicants must be district or building-level crisis teams from one of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Region 7 states: Kansas, Iowa, Missouri, and Nebraska.

Applicants must identify a core Learning Community team of 2 to 6 members. Ideally, the team would include representatives who are school leaders who can generate system level changes, but this is not required.

District participants should have or be working toward Comprehensive School Mental Health Systems (CSMHS) that have:

- A full array of tiered services,
- Collaborative school-community partnerships to address barriers to learning,
- Evidence-based practices, and
- Ability to address quality improvement
