




## How We Provide Training and TA

- Each Center develops a yearly workplan through needs assessments, advisory boards, and input from key stakeholders including state MH commissioners and SAMHSA Regional Administrators
- Centers consider:
  - Spread of services across the region/population
  - Intensity of services: universal, targeted, and intensive
  - Flexibility to respond to emerging needs
- Implementation science informs our strategies
  - Consider the context what is really needed to move an evidence-based practice forward?
    - Organizational development, systems work, policy, training, technical assistance
  - Use implementation strategies specific to the need
  - Maximize impact on service delivery systems

#### After a School Tragedy...Readiness, Response, Recovery, & Resources

Acts of violence, suicide, and other tragedies affect many school communities. In 2018, there were 82 school shootings, the highest number since 1970 (CHDS, 2019). Death by suicide is currently the 2<sup>nd</sup> leading cause of death among teenagers, next to [car] accidents (CDC, 2018). In 2017, 2 out of every 100 teenagers made suicide attempts serious enough to require medical treatment; 7 out of 100 attempted suicide (CDC, 2019).

These tragedies have a wide-ranging impact on the school community that extends far beyond the events of the day. Secondary trauma and complicated grief affect students, families, and school staff in ways that may appear immediately following a school tragedy or weeks, months, or years later. Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida is facing another wave of painful challenges after death by suicide of two student survivors of the March 14th, 2018, school shooting

How to Navigate Privacy and Technology

Identify whether your organization suggests a platform for tele-services



ntal Health (NCSMH)

- Find regulations that your school or agency may have for privacy
- At this time, HIPAA-compliant platforms are not federally required Determine the platform that meets
- your service and student needs

Is it safe and necessary to see one another?

Does the student have access to a cell phone or computer? Are there other barriers to technology?

- Pick a platform. Use professional accounts (e.g. email/phone) to the greatest degree possible. Practice using the platform with colleagues to gain
- Determine when you need to obtain consent from parents and keep them informed as best you can

How to Engage Your Team

- Identify relevant team members to contact (e.g. administrators, school counselors, school psychologists, school social workers)
- · Consider how you can partner with colleagues with telehealth experience, such as home-school providers
- Set a weekly or biweekly virtual meeting time
- Set an agenda and send it out prior to







### Context of Texas School Mental Health

- Prior to 2019-2020, limited state-level focus on school mental health services; some schools have adopted PBIS
- In 2019, Texas Legislature passed several school mental health bills
  - Required training for educators and administrators
  - Required "safe and supportive school" teams
  - Required multi-tiered systems of support to address 8 domains of mental health & school climate






### Context of Texas School Mental Health



- School Mental Health Survey (2019-2020)
  - 27% of schools reported having a SMH team
  - 57% reported using campus data to identify MH needs
  - 24% collected suggestions from students or families on MH
  - 40% have readily available SMH resource directory/map
  - 50% reported having counseling for MH issues
  - 20% reported having trauma-informed programs






## Context of Texas Education System

- 1,200 school districts
- Over 9,000 school campuses
- 20 Regional Service Centers

State statute says Regional Education Service Centers shall:


- Assist school districts in improving student performance in each region of the system;
- Enable school districts to operate more efficiently and economically; and
- Implement initiatives assigned by the legislature or the commissioner.





## Professional Learning Collaborative

- Goal: Increase the capacity of ESCs to support implementation of comprehensive school mental health systems
- Strategies:
  - Establish SMH teams in each ESC
  - SHAPE training and regional access
  - Monthly webinars based on National SMH Curriculum
  - Monthly office hours for technical assistance
  - SEA provided incentive for use in small and rural districts









#### Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSA) - Mental Health
