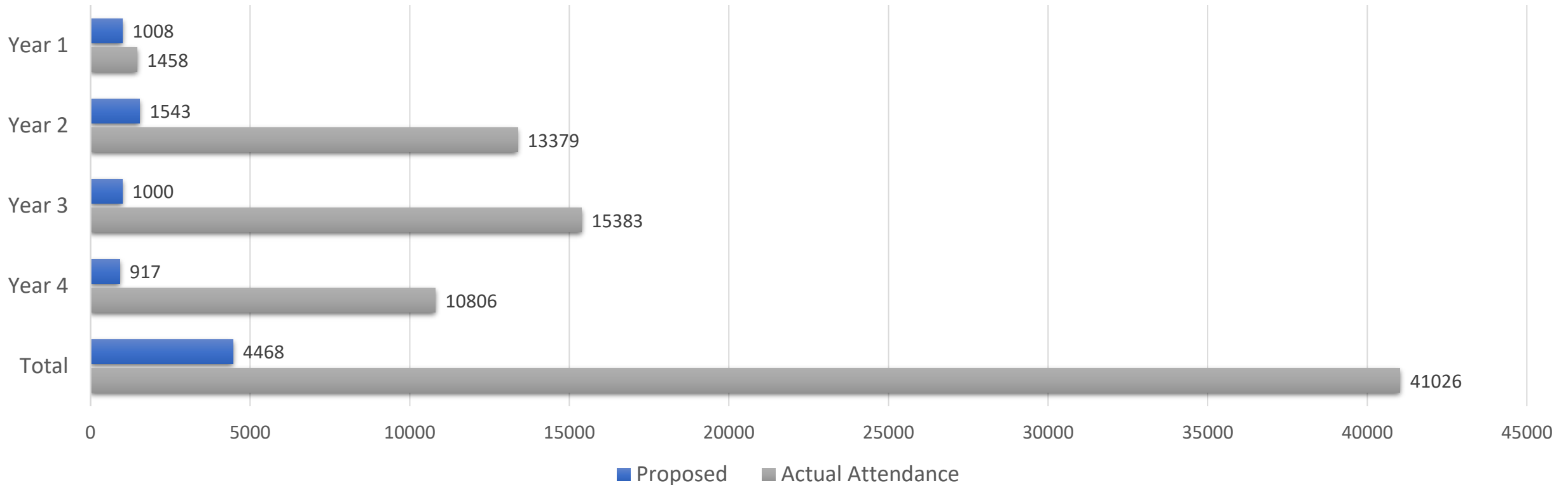

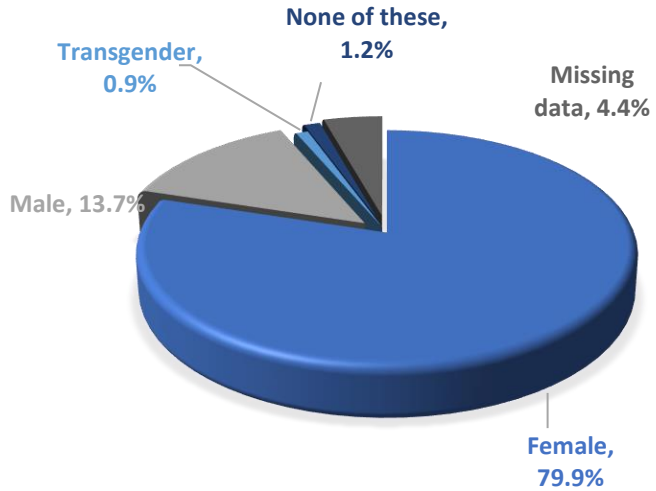

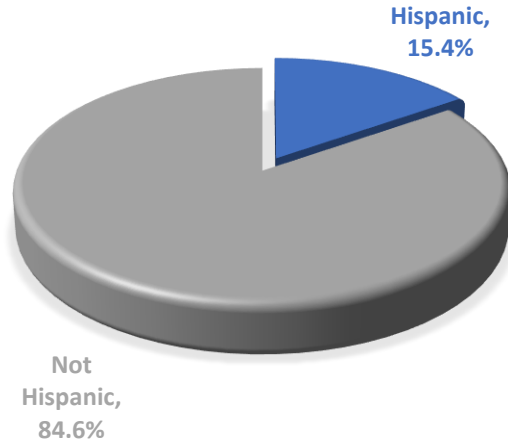

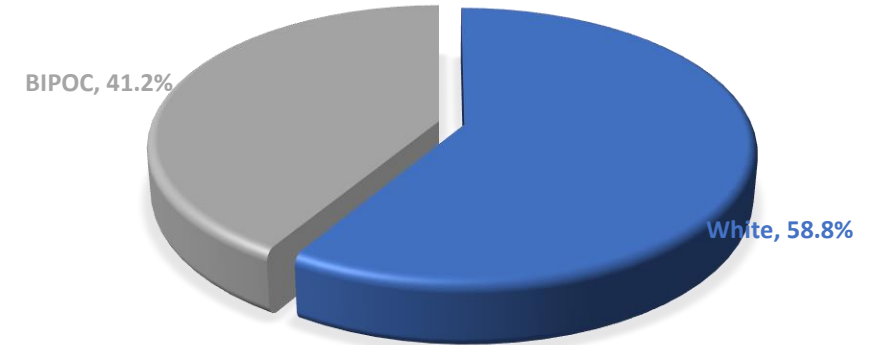
## YEAR 4: GENDER



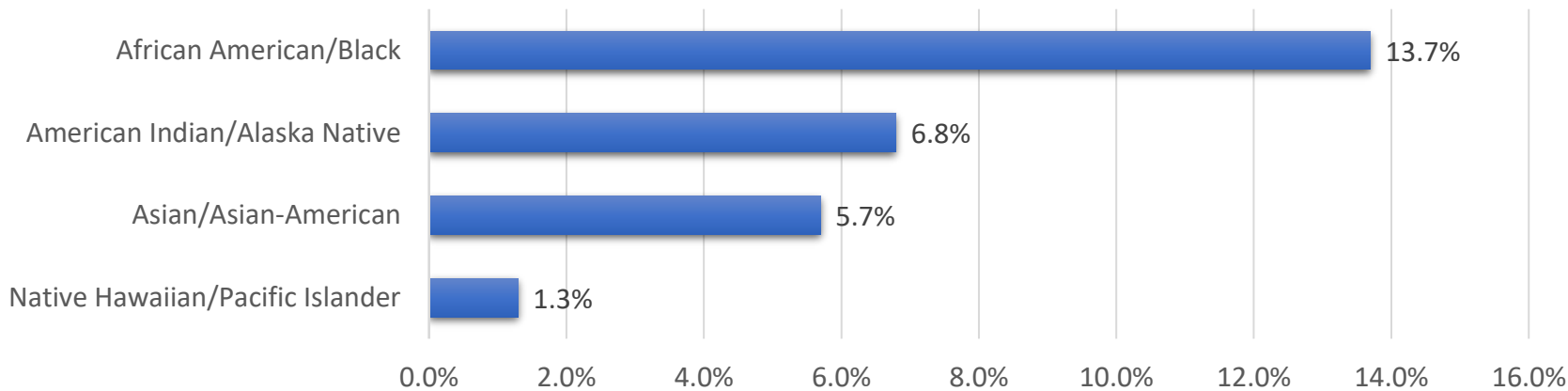
## YEAR 4: ETHNICITY

## Year 4: Non-White Racial Distribution

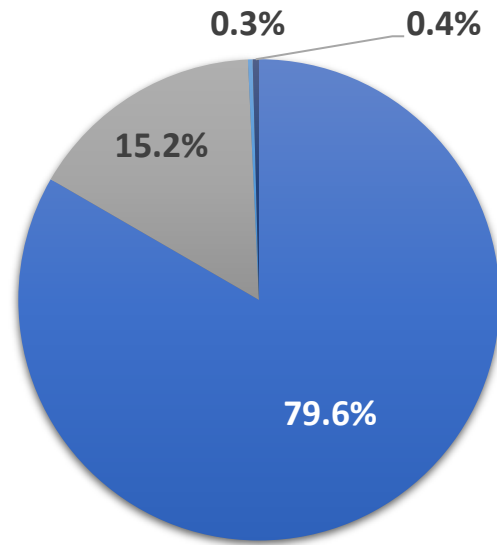

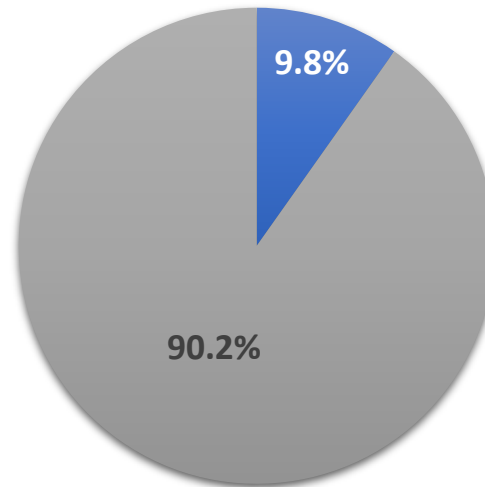

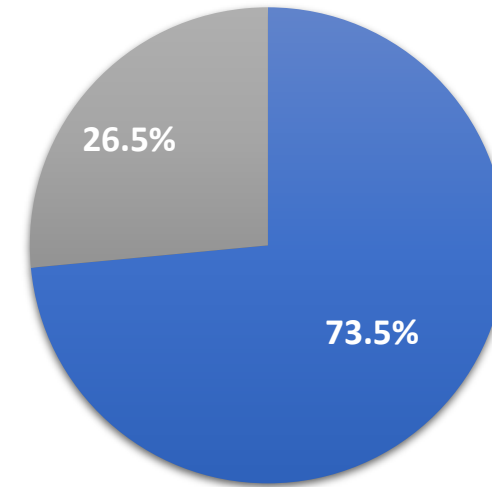
Year 2: Gender

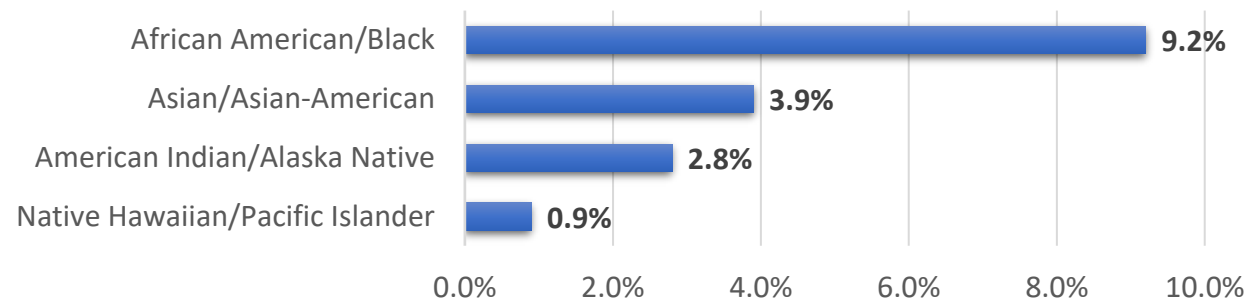

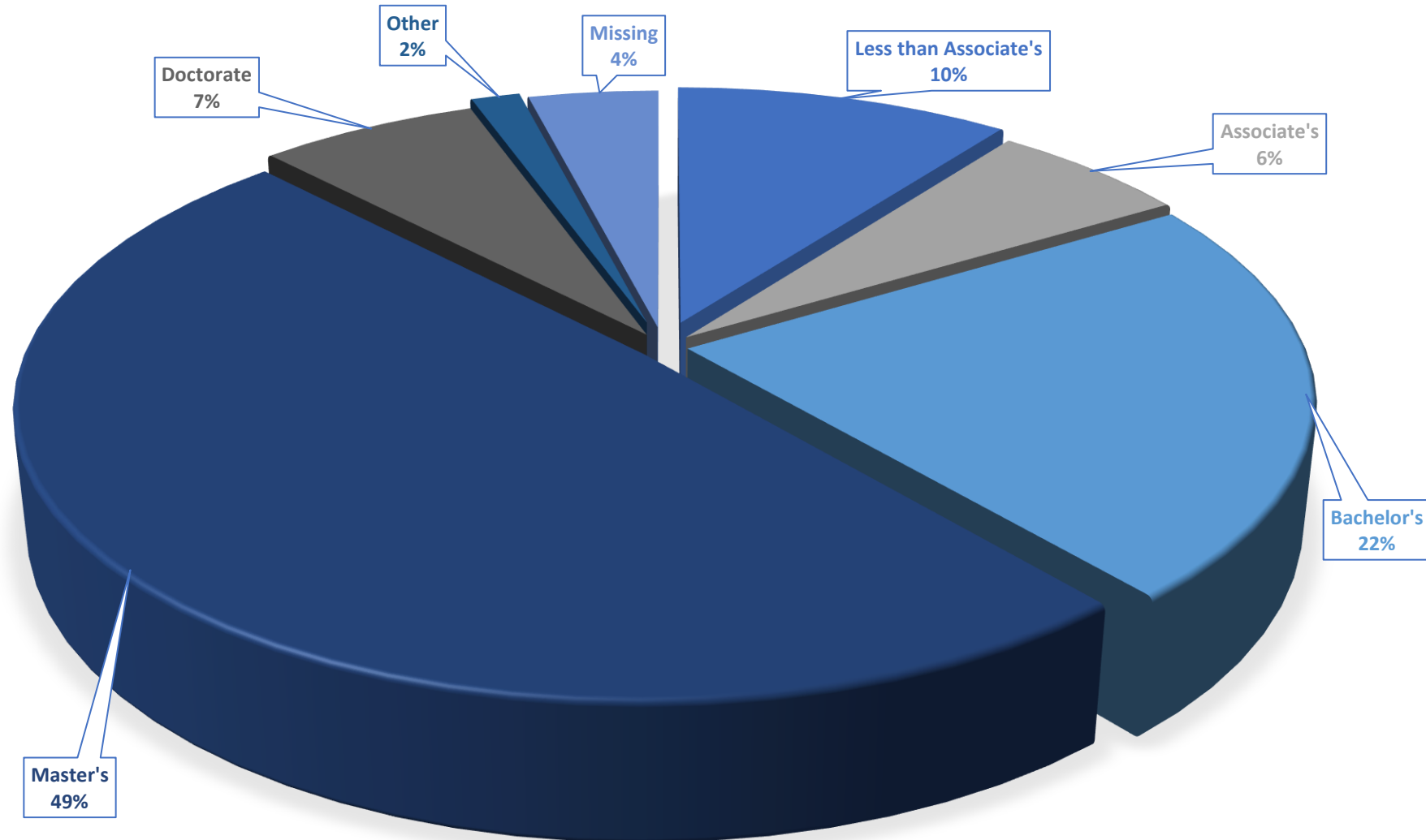
Year 2: Non-White Racial Distribution

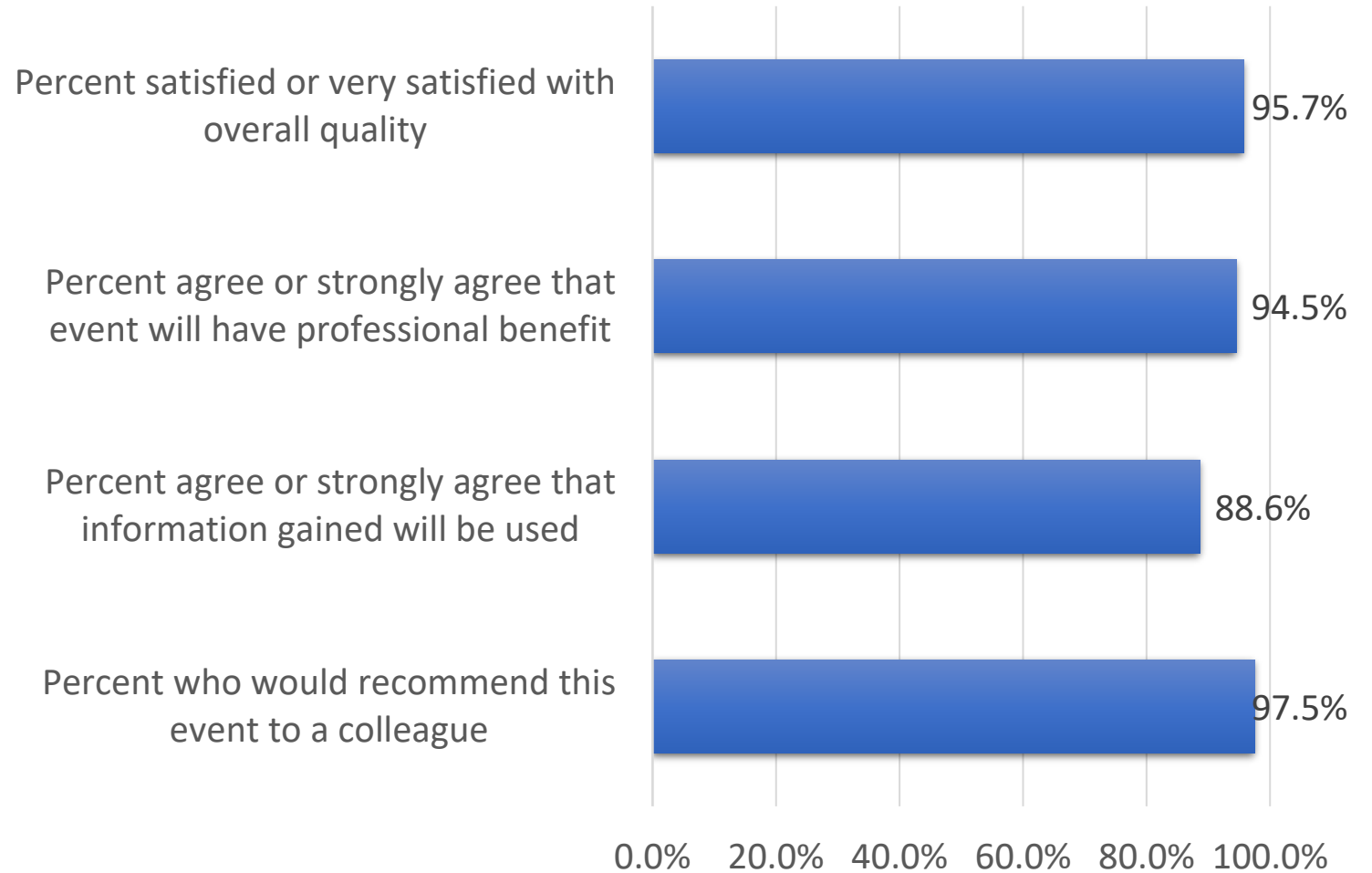

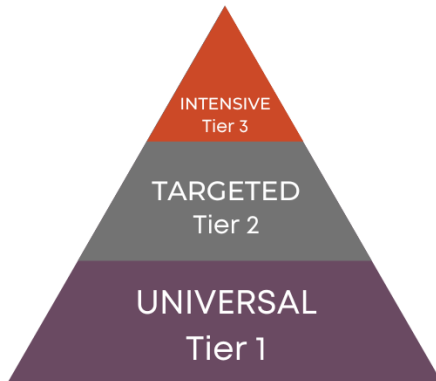

# How were online Learning Communities received?



## Anticipated impact from participants:

- *How to communicate effectively with people that are experiencing a wide variety of needs/stress*
- *Working with a diverse population, it will add more understanding to people I encounter*
- *Working to better engage and build rapport with the client population, which can be insular and self-protective*
- *Being more focused on promoting community connections*
- *How we approach staff regarding self-care and feelings of purpose*





# Training Plan Year 5



## Top-ranked training topics in Region 10

- Trauma (including trauma informed care)
- Co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders
- School-based mental and behavioral health promotion, prevention, and intervention services
- Motivational interviewing
- Crisis de-escalation
- Cultural considerations in mental health
- Grief, loss, and bereavement
- Mental health awareness and literacy (including mental health first aid and stigma)
- Positive behavior interventions and supports (PBIS)
- Microaggressions; implicit bias prevention and intervention in service design and implementation
