


# Progress towards GPRA targets: Number of participants



## Who have we served during year 4?




**Year 4: Non-White Racial Distribution** 



## Who have we served during year 2?




Year 2: Non-White Racial Distribution




### How were online Learning Communities received?





#### Anticipated impact from participants:
