




The Mid-America Mental Health Technology Transfer Center (MHTTC) provides training and technical assistance in integrated primary care, school mental health, serious mental illness, and behavioral health workforce development across Nebraska, Iowa, Kansas, and Missouri (HHS Region 7).

Overview

With new pandemic protections in place in Year 4, the Center was able to travel again for conferences and trainings. Travel proved to be a beneficial opportunity for catching up with colleagues, forming new connections, and growing organizational reach by facilitating sessions and presenting posters. The Center's impact was extended even further by the addition of new courses to KS-TRAIN (an affiliate of the TRAIN Learning Network) and HealtheKnowledge. The addition of these platforms allow the Center to reach new audiences and make evidence-based mental health practices even more accessible than before.

Integrated Primary Care Technical Assistance

Technical assistance is a core component of the Mid-America MHTTC. In the past year, Integrated Primary Care Director Dr. Holly Roberts continued our efforts to provide in-depth technical assistance (TA) by working with 10 healthcare organizations from across the United States. Within these 10 organizations, Dr. Roberts provided TA to 20 organization recipients. These sessions allowed for the organizations to hold pointed conversations on the implementation and improvement of integrated primary care practices, as well as discuss workforce expansion within the field. 
