







Criteria for Selecting System Change Ideas

- a) How actionable is the idea and does it have a clear scope?
- b) We selected ideas that fell under the High Impact/High Ease or Medium Impact / Medium Ease category.
- a) Is this a strategy that is consistent with stigma reducing evidence-based practices?
- b) How long will this take? (We would like to pick something that can be accomplished in the next year)




- A. Peer Support Workers as Stewards of the Community Bring together community partners to engage in training for outreach and peer workers (harm reduction, SUD, mental health, stigma).

 - c) Provide mental health first aid training in the community.




B. Community Education Panel/Advisory Board to provide education with members who have boots on the ground to advise doctors, patrol officers, outreach workers, MH providers, social workers.

- b. Amplify the voices and stories of those impacted by stigma.




C. Use Opioid Settlement funds to support a workgroup tasked with reducing stigma.

- b) Amplify the voices and stories of those impacted by stigma.




D. Develop a Master Assessment to be used across organizations (LA County does this).




E. Well-funded and legitimate housing support program. Decrease landlord stigma, spread the word among themselves and support renters.

- a. Encourage community leaders to share personal stories in their networks.
- b. Amplify the voices and stories of those impacted by stigma



F. Develop a policy to adopt best practices for crisis response (eg. Using SAMHSA's five principles guide) - Pilot this to see how well it works to get a 25% implementation and tipping point

- a. Provide mental health first aid training in the community.
- b. Create relationships with law enforcement.
- c. Amplify the voices and stories of those impacted by stigma.
