

Activities to Enhance School-based Mental Health

The South Southwest Mental Health Technology Transfer Center (SSW-MHTTC), funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), serves U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Region 6, including Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas. The SSW-MHTTC has targeted funding to support training, technical assistance, and workforce development to enhance school-based mental health services and effective collaboration between schools and community-based mental health agencies. The following opportunities will be available:

For state leaders:

- Participation in a state-level assessment of the school mental health system, including the development
 of a state report
- Support for state leader participation in a National School Mental Health Learning Collaborative led by the <u>Center for School Mental Health</u> at the University of Maryland School of Medicine
- Product development and state-specific targeted technical assistance to educational authorities by the Center for School Mental Health

For educational service center, district or campus leaders:

- Training in Psychological First Aid for Schools and Skills for Psychological Recovery
- Training and technical assistance in the selection and implementation of mental health screening tools
- Tailored training and technical assistance in creating a trauma-sensitive school

For teachers and school personnel:

- Participation in an assessment of best practices in school-based mental health through the School
 Health Assessment and Performance Evaluation (SHAPE) System
- Access to suicide prevention gatekeeper training through Kognito At Risk role-play simulation
- Training in Collaborative and Proactive Solutions

For school-based mental health clinicians:

- Initial and advanced training in Collaborative and Proactive Solutions
- Training, coaching, and implementation support for Cognitive Behavioral Intervention in Schools (<u>CBITS</u>)
- Training in in Psychological First Aid for Schools and Skills for Psychological Recovery
