SUICIDE PREVENTION

There has been a steady rise in suicide rates among adolescents and young adults in the United States and suicide has climbed to be the 2nd leading cause for death among school-aged youth. Educators are key players in carrying out suicide prevention strategies for school-aged youth. As students spend on average over 1,000 hours at school each year, schools play a vital role in the health and wellbeing of our young people.

SAMHSA's <u>Suicide Prevention in Schools</u> issue brief was created to offer meaningful ways that administrators, faculty, staff, parents, and students can contribute to an environment that mitigates risk factors for suicide. This includes ensuring that all school personnel understand the warning signs for suicidal ideation; recognizing the key role that each member of the school community plays in implementing prevention; and building a comprehensive suicide prevention infrastructure in your school. The issue brief includes many practical strategies to build suicide prevention efforts, including specific programmatic recommendations.

The purpose of *the* **Great Lakes MHTTC Suicide Prevention Guide** is to provide local and state specific resources for school personnel in the Great Lakes MHTTC Region (IL, IN, MI, MN, OH, and WI). The resources in this guide highlight intervention services available for immediate support. All states have access to 24/7 free, confidential support via telephone and text. Many areas have mobile crisis response units available for immediate in-person assessment and intervention. Additionally, students have access to free or sliding-scale ongoing counseling support in the community when it is not available at their schools.

Also included in this guide are our region's suicide prevention strategies for schools. These state-specific tools can be used to assist schools in creating comprehensive youth suicide prevention programming.
