


Southeast Mental Health State Fact Sheet: Tennessee

State Mental Health Agency: Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (DMHSAS)

State Mental Health System

DMHSAS works with council members in all seven regions and contracts community-based providers to:

- Provide statewide mobile crisis services to individuals of all ages
- Provide recovery support services for Tennesseans with mental illness and substance abuse issues

Training Opportunities in Tennessee

- DMHSAS provides online and in-person trainings on crisis services and suicide prevention
- The Tennessee Association of Mental Health Organizations partners with DMHSAS to offer trainings on topics including co-occurring disorders and behavioral health and disaster preparedness
- DMHSAS contracts with the Tennessee Mental Health Consumers' Association to provide training and certification for peer specialists
