# Distinctive Features of Medicaid Programs: Southeast Region

### Alabama

• Administers Medicaid through a Primary Care Case Management (PCCM) delivery system

## Florida

- Medicaid Managed Care plans administer benefits, contracted by region rather than statewide
- 11 different service regions with about 5.7 managed care plans providing benefits per region, on average

### Georgia

- Comparatively low Medicaid/CHIP participation rates among children, relative to the other states in the Southeast
- As of fall 2018, a new Medicaid Managed Care plan, CareSource, entered the market, becoming the state's fourth managed care organization

### Kentucky

- Several recent structural changes in Medicaid benefit administration:
  - Medicaid expansion under the Affordable Care Act via unique waiver with enrollment through the Kentucky Health Benefit Exchange marketplace
  - o Work requirement waiver proposal
  - o New Substance Use Disorder program for all Medicaid enrollees

#### Mississippi

- 65% of Medicaid beneficiaries are enrolled in Medicaid Managed Care plans, of which the state has only two.
- Their Medicaid/CHIP parent participation rates are the only ones in the region that have declined (-4.7%) in recent years

## North Carolina

- Several reforms under debate or in process, including:
  - o Medicaid Expansion under the Affordable Care Act
  - Administration of benefits through comprehensive risk-based managed care (versus current Primary Care Case Management system)

## South Carolina

- Recently developed work requirement waiver proposal
- Innovative data infrastructure that supports linking Medicaid beneficiary data with education outcomes and participation in other public programs

### Tennessee

- First state in the U.S. to enroll 100% of Medicaid beneficiaries in Medicaid Managed Care plans on a mandatory basis
- As of 2015, all Medicaid Managed Care plans administer benefits statewide (previously TN was divided into 3 service regions: West, Central, and East)
- Has the highest income eligibility level for pregnant women in the region
