David A. Jobes, Ph.D., ABPP, is a Professor of Psychology, Director of the Suicide Prevention Laboratory, and Associate Director of Clinical Training at The Catholic University of America. He is also an Adjunct Professor at the Uniformed Services University School of Medicine in the Department of Psychiatry. He has published six books and numerous peer-reviewed journal articles. Dr. Jobes is a past President of the American Association of Suicidology (AAS), and he is the recipient of various awards for his scientific work. He has been a consultant to multiple governmental agencies. Dr. Jobes is a member of the Scientific Council and the Public Policy Council of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP). He is board-certified in clinical psychology and maintains a private clinical, consulting, and forensic practice in Washington DC.
