

Preventing Suicide in Healthcare Settings: What We Are Learning

Description

This webinar will examine suicide prevention in health care settings. It will compare progress that has been made in reducing cardiovascular disease (CVD) deaths with the lack of progress in reducing suicide deaths. Interventions that have reduced CVD deaths will be compared with interventions that are available to reduce suicide in terms of effectiveness and cost. The available tools for "suicide care" have comparable effectiveness and cost to effective CVD interventions. We should focus on improved use of these effective tools.

About the Presenter

Dr. Michael Hogan served as New York State Commissioner of Mental Health from 2007-2012, and now operates a consulting practice in health and behavioral health care focusing on health care issues with significant public health impact, especially suicide prevention. Previously, he served as Director of the Ohio Department of Mental Health, Commissioner of the Connecticut Department of Mental Health, the first behavioral health representative on the board of The Joint Commission, and a member of the National Action Alliance for Suicide Prevention. Additionally, he chaired the President's New Freedom Commission on Mental Health. His awards for national leadership include recognition by the National Governor's Association, National Alliance on Mental Illness, Campaign for Mental Health Reform, American College of Mental Health Administration and American Psychiatric Association. He is a graduate of Cornell University; he earned a Master's degree from the College at Brockport and a PhD from Syracuse University.
