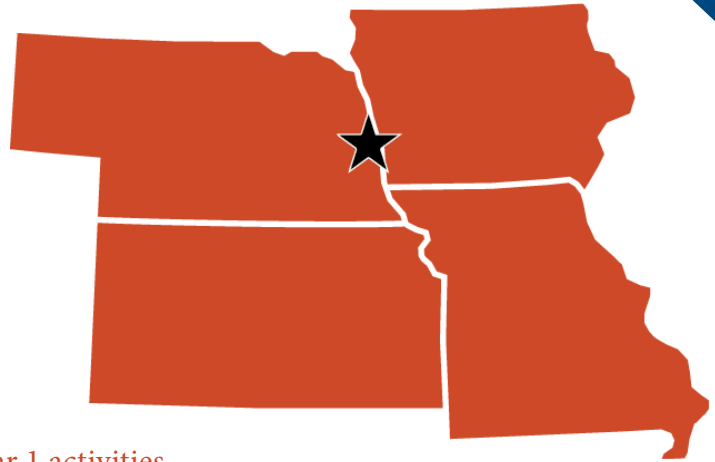

## OUR CENTER

The Mid-America Mental Health Technology Transfer Center provides technical training and assistance throughout HHS Region 7, in Nebraska, Iowa, Missouri and Kansas. From our headquarters at the University of Nebraska Medical Center in Omaha, our Center primarily works within four core training areas: integrated care, school mental health, serious mental illness and behavioral health workforce development.

## ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN CORE TRAINING AREAS



### INTEGRATED BEHAVIORAL HEALTH IN PRIMARY CARE

Our Center's main area of focus is the integration of behavioral health into primary care. In Year 1, one of our foremost accomplishments was our formation of a training partnership with the Comprehensive Primary Care Plus (CPC+) program, an initiative of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS), resulting in substantial webinar- and conference-based training in Nebraska, Missouri and Kansas.

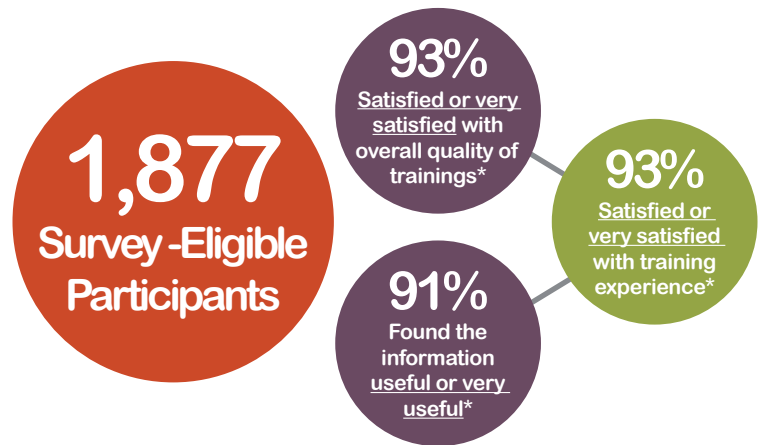
- ✓ Co-developed a legislatively funded survey of state mental health providers to assist the Kansas Department of Mental Health with needs assessment

## AUDIENCE

### Survey Data

As a SAMHSA-funded entity, our Center is required to administer event feedback surveys to trainees. According to this data, our Center trained nearly 2,000 people in Y1 and received overall positive feedback. Not all events were surveyable under HHS/SAMHSA guidelines, which take into account the length and format of the trainings, so the 1,877 figure represents an approximation of our reach.
