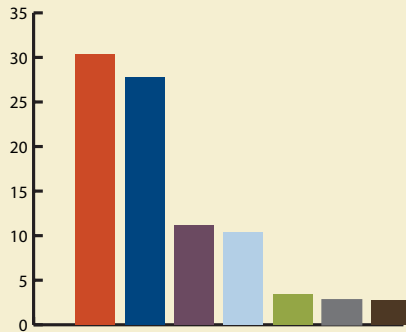

GENDER BREAKDOWN

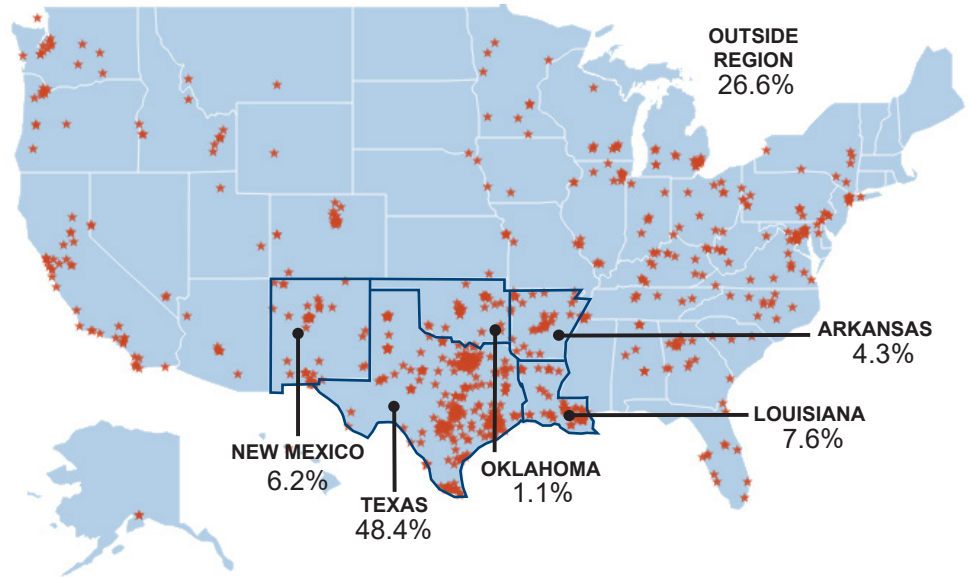


82.3% Women, 17.7% Men

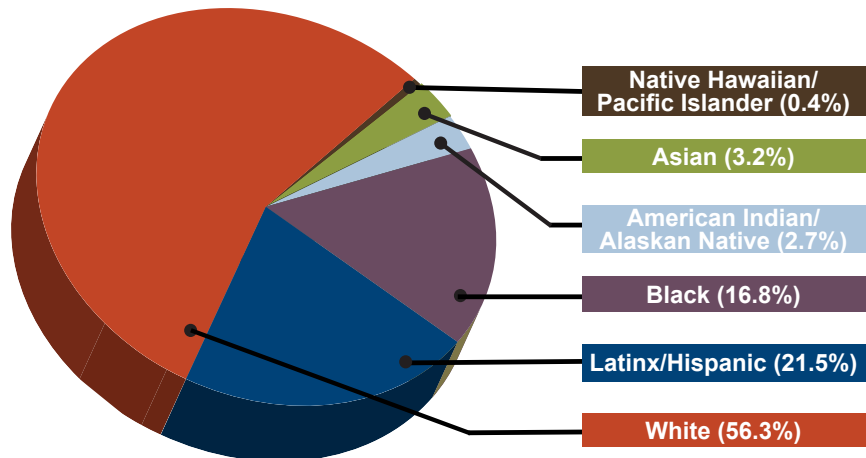
Our Mission
