



Purpose of the Healthy Minds Network

- Producing knowledge (research)
- Distributing knowledge (dissemination)
- Using knowledge (practice)



The Healthy Minds Study



Healthy Minds Study

- Started in 2005
- Annual, web-based survey
- > 300 schools; > 300,000 student participants
- Random sample at each institution
- 20-30 minutes to complete
- At the end of survey, informs students about mental health resources





Survey Topics

2020-2021 COVID-19 Module

- Developed in collaboration with the American College Health Association (ACHA)
- Piloted in Spring 2020 during the advent of the pandemic and modified to current needs
- Questions aimed at personal experience with COVID-19 and wellbeing outcomes

Mental Health Measures in HMS

- •Depression (PHQ-9) (Kroenke & Spitzer, 2002)
- •Anxiety (GAD-7) (Spitzer et al., 2006)
- •Eating disorders (SCOFF) (Morgan et al., 1999)
- •Non-suicidal self-injury, past year
- •Suicidal ideation, past year

How HMS Data Are Used to Create Change

- Raise awareness of mental health and campus resources
- Assess need for programs and services
- Advocate for mental health resources, services and programs on campus
- Evaluate existing programs (e.g. reductions in stigma following amajor campaign)
- Compare current mental health climate with peer institutions
- Strengthen grant applications (e.g. SAMHSAGarrett Lee Smithgrants)




Severe Depressive Symptoms (Healthy Minds Study)

Major Depression by Year




Positive Screen for Depression (Healthy Minds Study)

Any Depression by Year




Severe Anxiety Symptoms (Healthy Minds Study)

Severe Anxiety (GAD-7) by Year




Positive Screen for Anxiety (Healthy Minds Study)

Any GAD 10 or Above by Year




Eating Disorders Symptoms (Healthy Minds Study)

Positive Screen for Eating Disorder by Year




Non-suicidal Self-injury

Non-suicidal Self-injury (past year) by Year




Suicide Ideation

Suicide Idea by Year




Therapy/Counseling Use (Healthy Minds Study)

Any Therapy Ever by Year




Service Use among Students with Symptoms (Healthy Minds Study)




Flourishing (Positive Mental Health) (Healthy Minds Study)

Flourishing by Year




Stigma ("I Would Think Less of Someone...") (Healthy Minds Study)

Related Factors: Students of Color

- Overt & covert bias
- Intersectionality (Crenshaw, 1989)
- Unique challenges to their emotional wellbeing and adjustment to college life
- Report feeling overwhelmed most or all of the time during their first term

Protective Factors:


- Inclusive environments
- Physical spaces and organizations for students of color
- Counseling staff reflective of student population


Related Factors: Gender Identity and Sexual Orientation

- Overt & covert bias on therise
- Intersectionality (Crenshaw, 1989)
- Unique challenges other students may not face related to their identity
 - Housing
 - Name change policies

Protective Factors:

- Campus dedication to non-bias environment
- Physical spaces and organizations for LGBTQ+ students
- Counseling staff who specialize in meeting needs of LGBTQ+students


