

Latinos	Almost 2x as likely to live in food insecure households than non-Hispanic whites (Coleman-Jensen et al., 2019)
Native Americans	18 of the 28 counties with majority Native American populations are projected to be high food insecurity counties (i.e., Center for American Indian Health, 2020)
Black individuals	2.4x as likely to live in food insecure households than non-Hispanic whites (Coleman-Jensen et al., 2019)
Disabled adults	Due to limited employment opportunities and healthcare related expenses (Coleman-Jensen & Nord, 2013; Huang et al., 2010)
