What School Mental Health Services Does Medicaid Cover?

Medicaid can cover many mental health screening services and treatment services provided in schools, as well as supportive services to facilitate treatment.

Screening Services



The Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) benefit is a mandatory benefit for all Medicaid-enrolled children under 21 years old. ESPDT covers many screening services for mental health problems, including autism screening, depression screening, and psychosocial assessment. Treatment Services



Psychosocial treatment For example:

- Counseling
- Case management
- Social work services*

Psychotropic medication* For example:

- Antidepressants*
- Stimulant medications*

Supportive Services



Medicaid covers supportive services* through reimbursement for administrative expenses. Schools can seek Medicaid reimbursement for supportive services that help children receive mental health services at community providers (e.g., arranging transportation or referrals).
