


Gender Diversity Continuum


There are many ways to talk about the gender identity continuum. Below, you will find two approaches to understanding and talking about this concept, along with free resources related to each conceptualization. Both concepts take into account that gender identity, expression, sex, and attraction are all unique components that make up a person's gender.

The Genderbread Person v4 by its pronounced METR Sexual and



The Genderbread Person depicts the components of gender identity and shows that there are spectrums of femininity and masculinity. Another spectrum is titled Anatomical Sex and refers to physical traits an individual is born with that may be perceived as feminine or masculine.



The Gender Unicorn is a similar graphic. However, it adds a spectrum for Other within each topic area to represent the genders outside of the western dichotomy. They have also removed the spectrum for anatomical sex. Finally, they've changed the language for attraction which relates more with sexual orientation but can be adjacent to gender.
