### Self-Awareness

 Understand one's own emotions, thoughts, and values and how they influence behavior across contexts

### Self-Management

 Manage one's emotions, thoughts, values & behaviors in different situations and to achieve goals and aspirations

### Social Awareness

Understand the perspectives of & empathize with others, including those from diverse backgrounds

### Relationship Skills

 Establish and maintain healthy, supportive relationships and effectively navigate settings with diverse individuals/groups

# Responsible Decision-Making

 Make caring and constructive choices about personal behavior and social interactions across diverse situations



#### TELL ME MORE

- More than simply teaching skills through standalone lessons
- > Systemic approach across settings
- > Cohesive approach to learning
- > Needs to be a part of school culture

"SEL programs appear to have as <u>great</u> a <u>long-term</u> impact on academic growth as has been found in programs designed specifically academic learning"



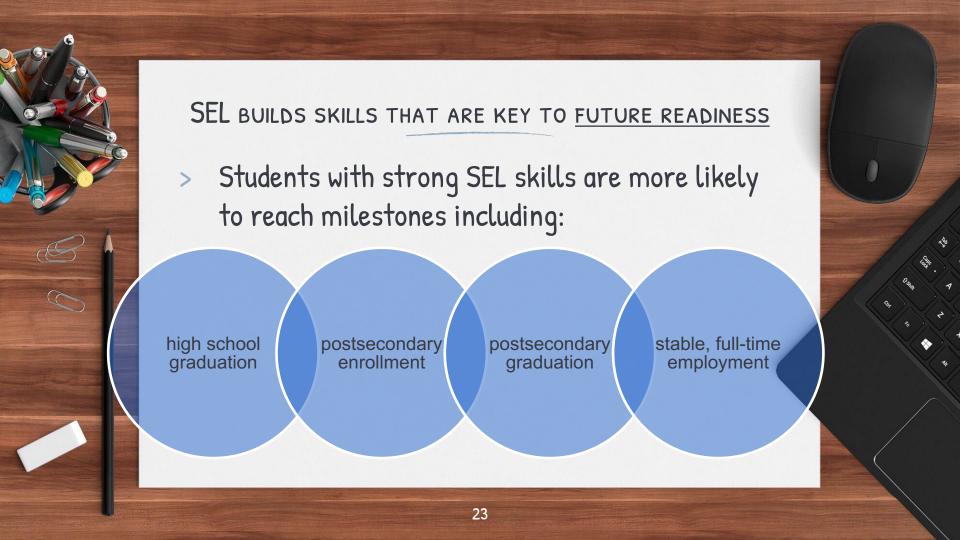

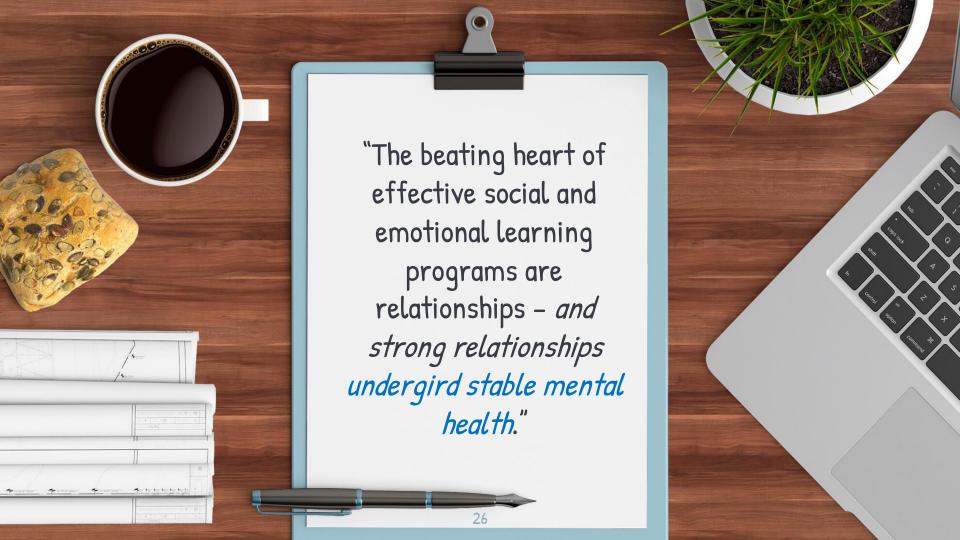
#### SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING IMPROVES WELL-BEING

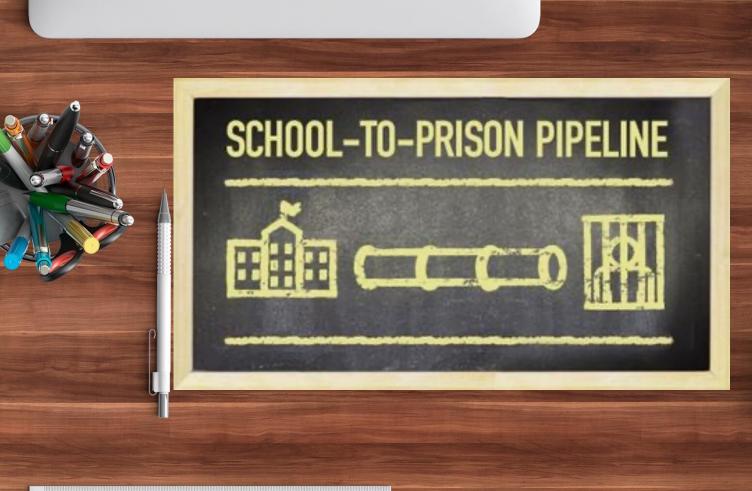
- > Students experienced
  - Decreased emotional distress
  - Fewer externalizing behaviors
  - Improved prosocial behaviors
- Social and emotional learning can also reduce symptoms of depression and anxiety in the short term













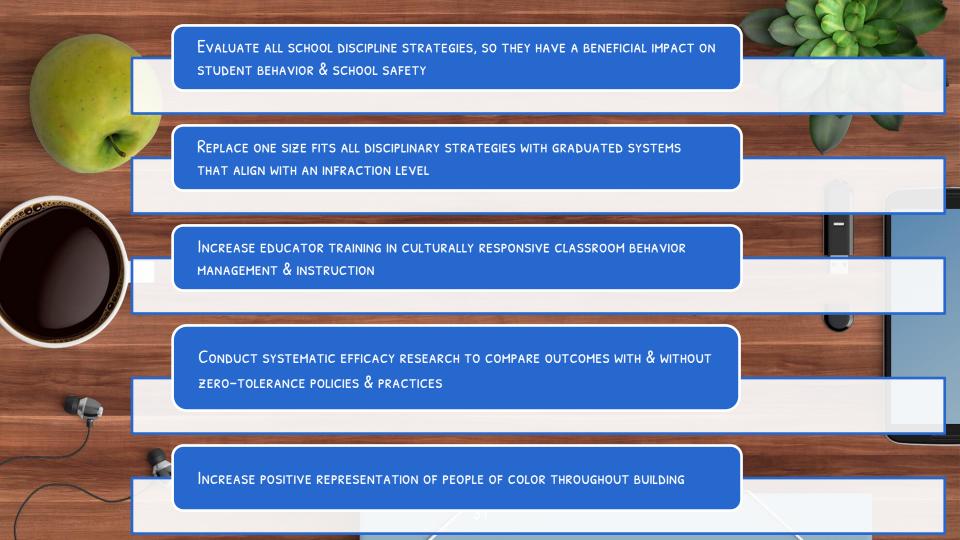
#### BE MINDFUL OF THE SCHOOL TO PRISON PIPELINE

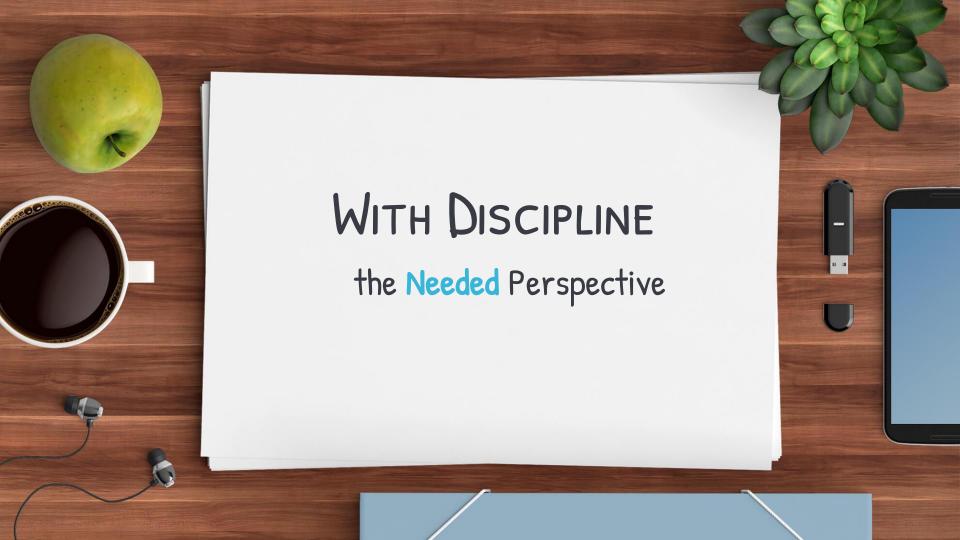
School policies & practices that lead students out of regular school environment into more restrictive settings (juvenile justice system & alternative education programs)

- Significant
   disproportionality in the use
   of out-of-school suspension
   specifically in children of
   color & children with
   disabilities
- Discipline is more utilized for students of color despite engaging in the <u>same</u> <u>behavior</u> as white peers
- "Black Escalation Effect" (Okonofua & Eberhardt, 2015)

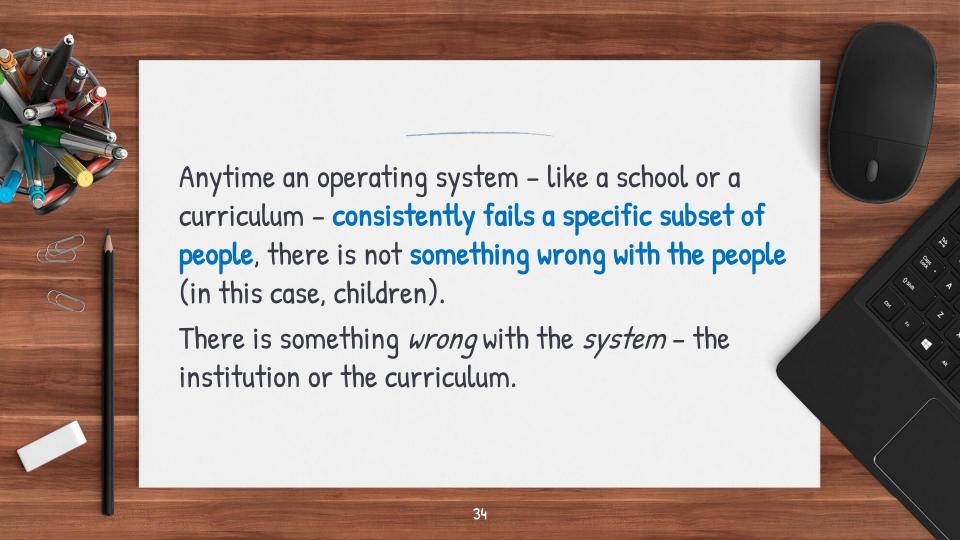




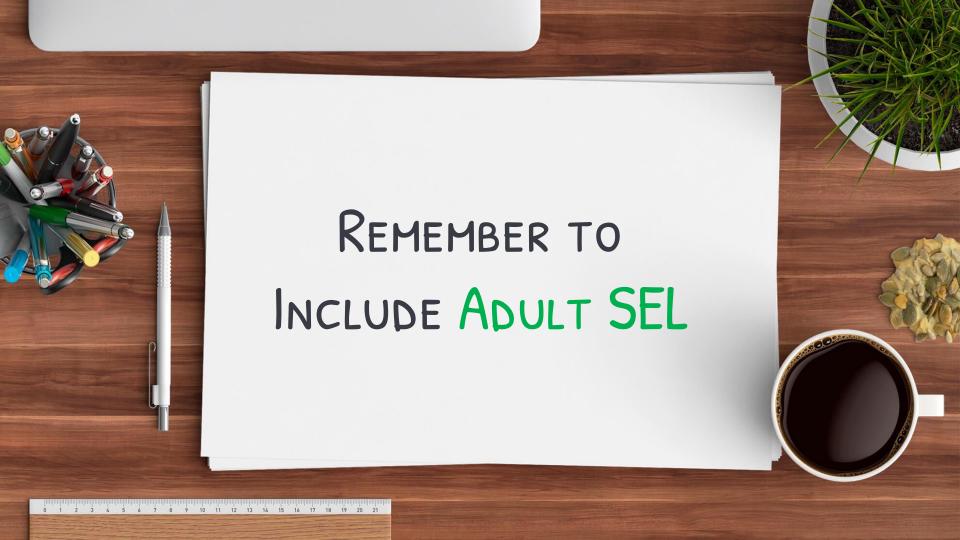
















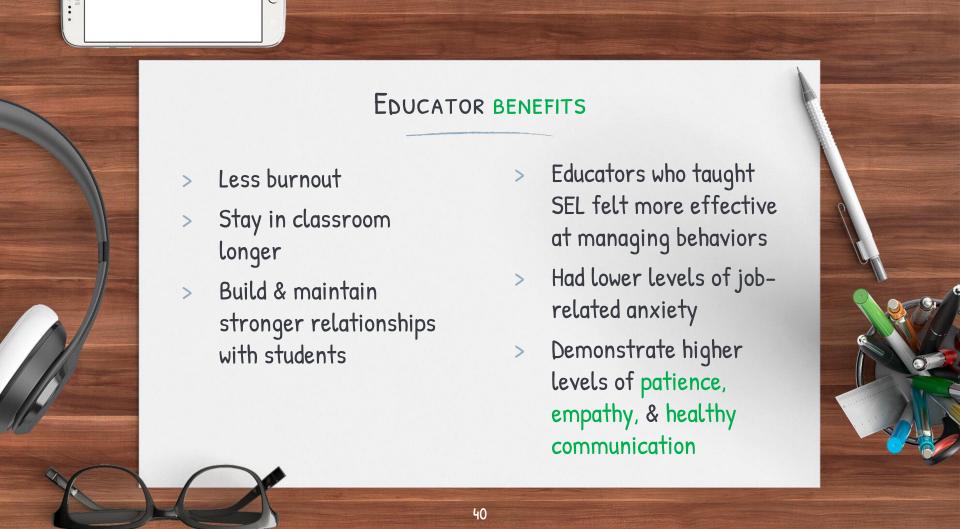
#### ADULT SEL

- Intentional and explicit attention to supporting adult SEL
- > Educators' social and emotional competence (SEC) is linked to well-being & SEC of children & youth
  - critical for implementation of SEL programs
     & practices

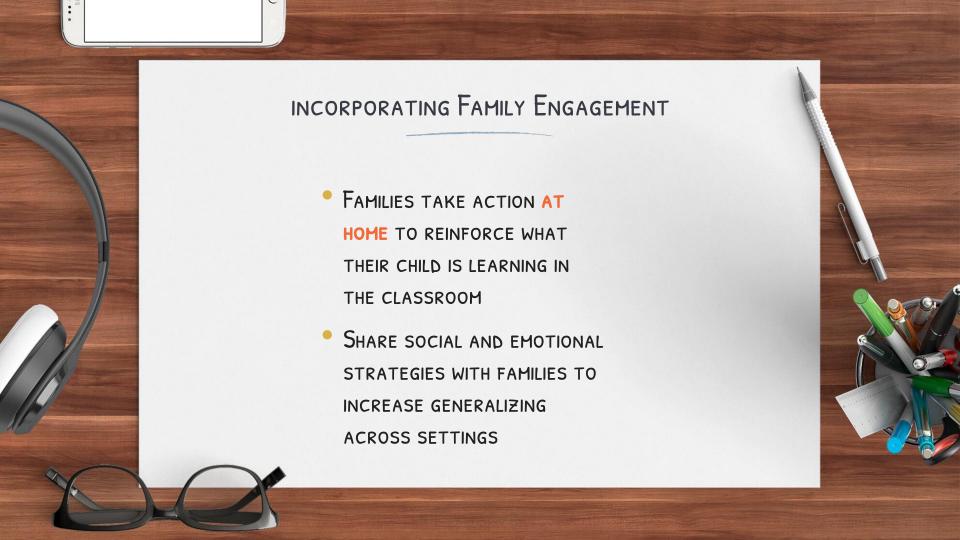

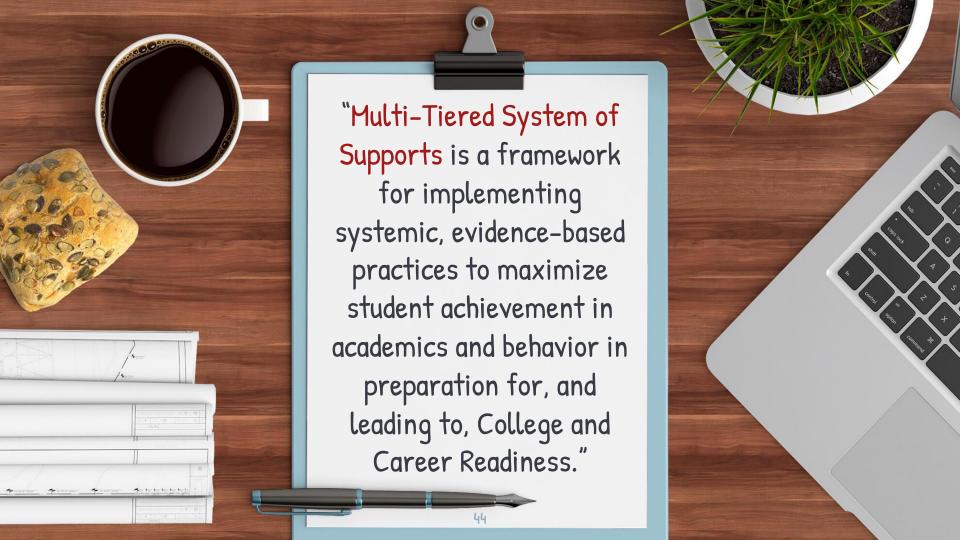
- Educators' social & emotional skills are malleable and can be promoted through evidence-based programs
- > Integrating SEL into educator preparation is essential for scaling SEL into classrooms

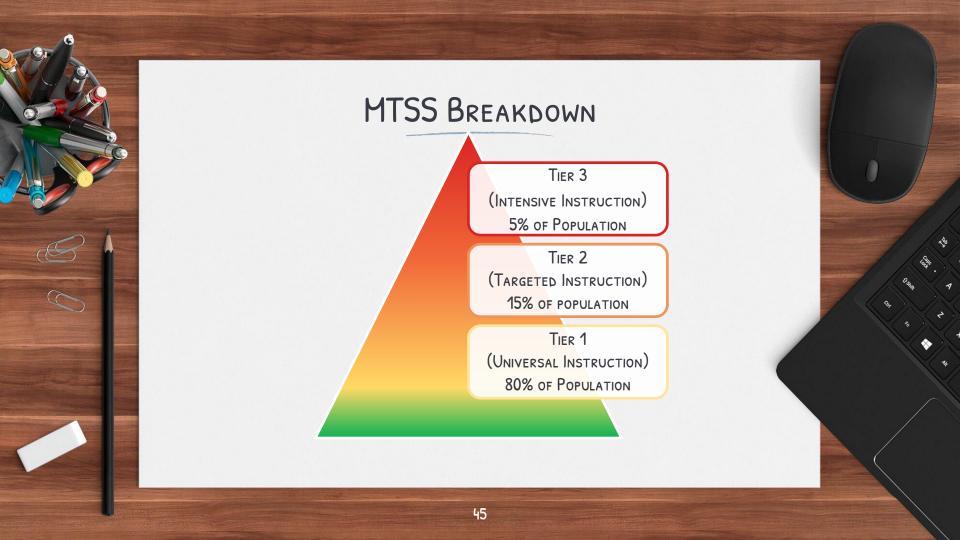


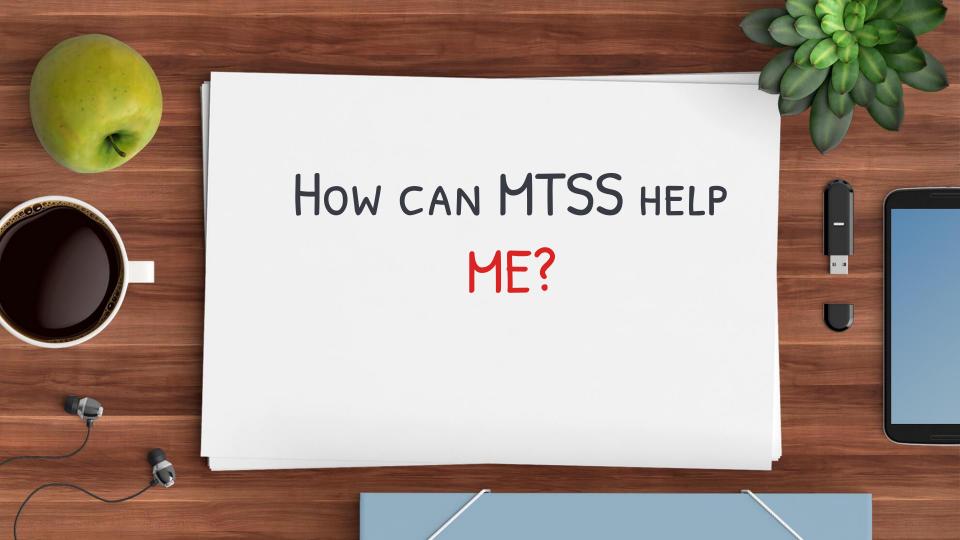


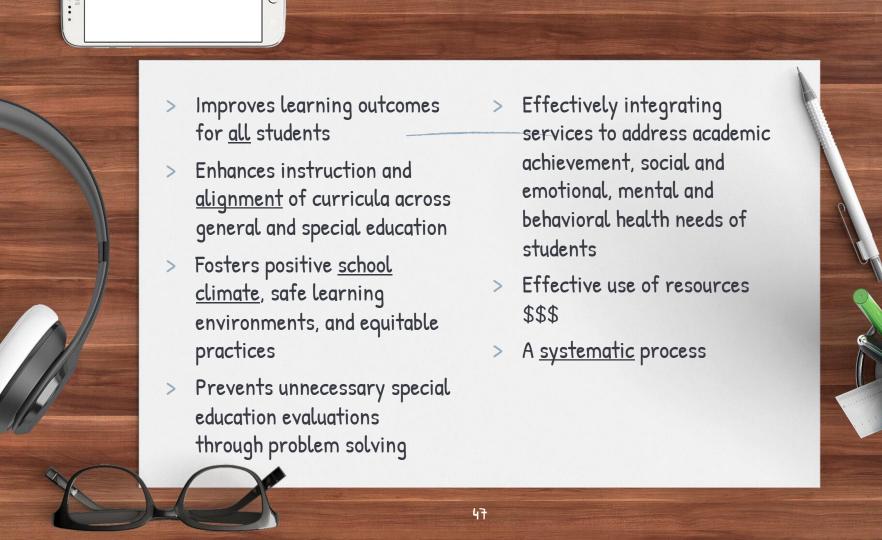


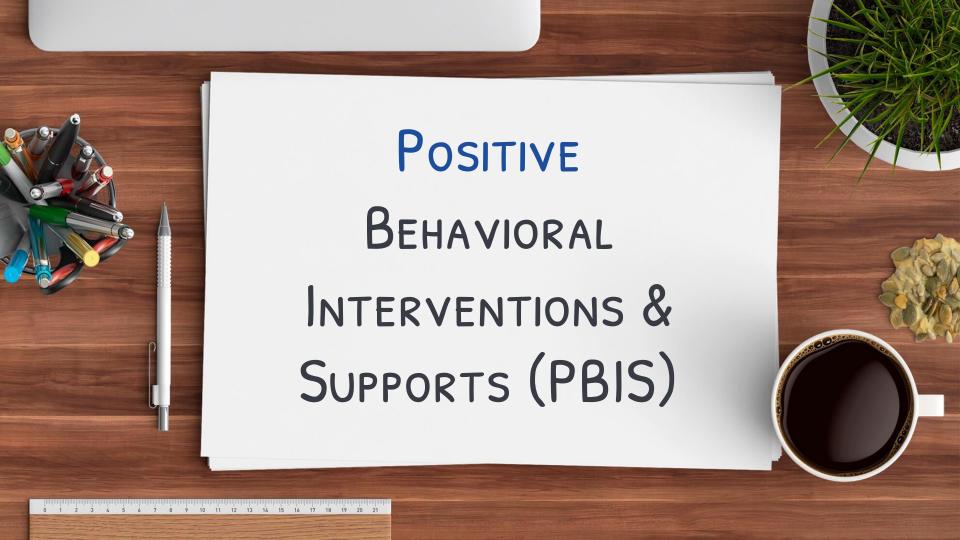








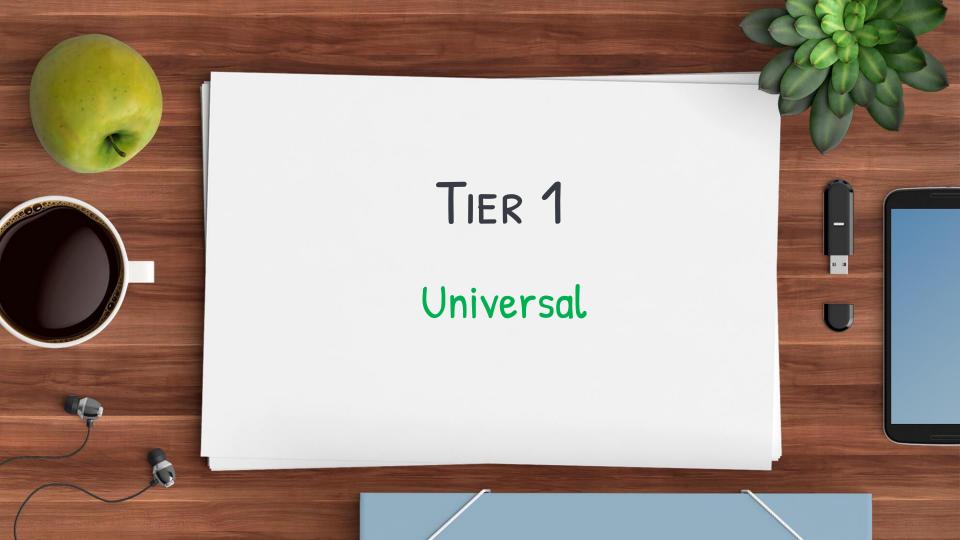






# **PBIS**

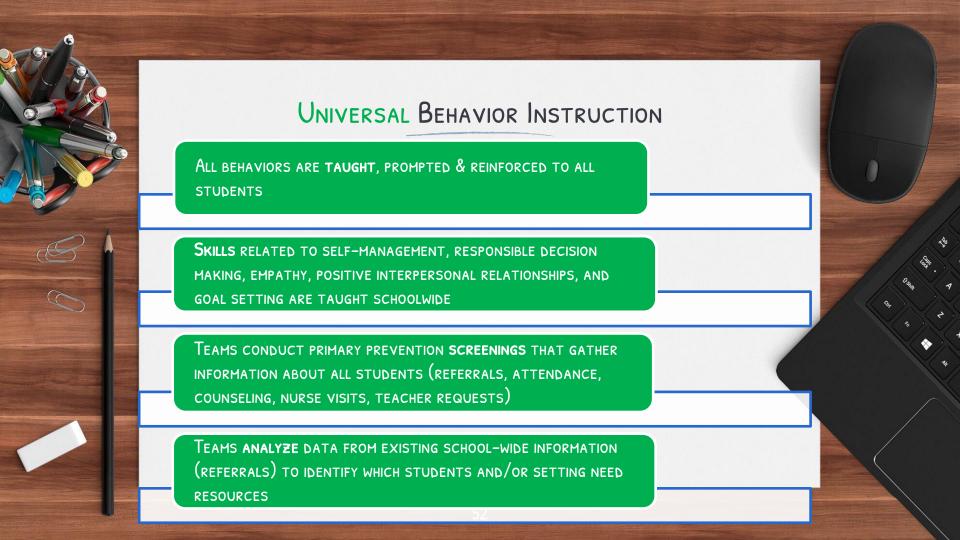
- > Based on problem-solving model
- Prevents inappropriate behavior through teaching & reinforcing appropriate behaviors
- > Significantly reduces student suspensions, office discipline referrals, tardiness, unexcused absences, bullying, and feelings of rejection among students





#### CLASSROOMS ARE KEY

- > Students spend the <u>majority</u> of their time in classrooms
- > Students can learn and practice SEL/PBIS through explicit instruction, trusting relationships & academic integration

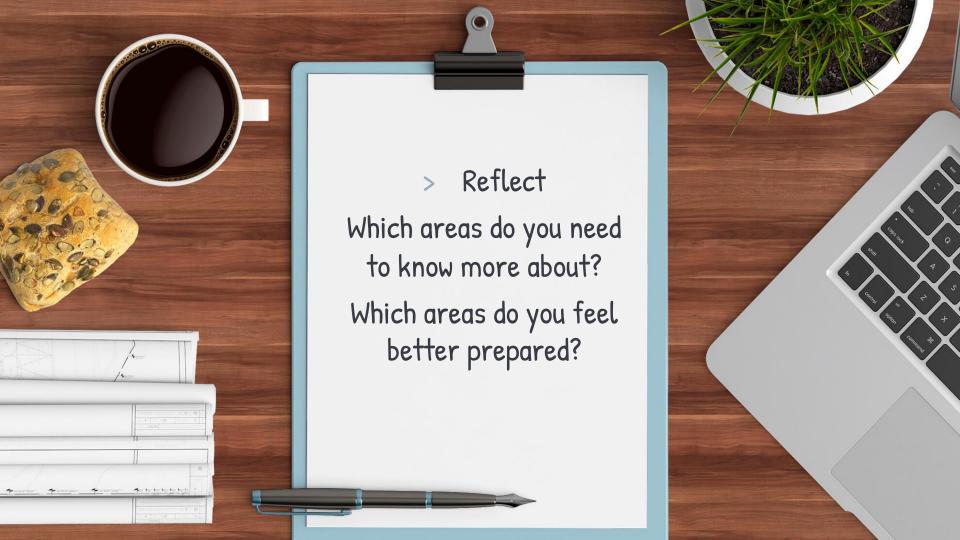


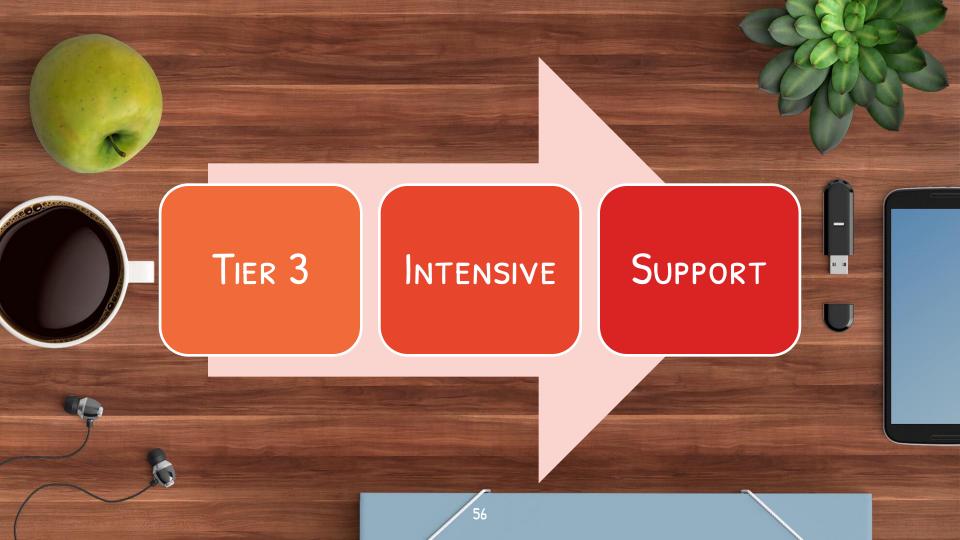


# TARGETED ENVIRONMENTAL ADJUSTMENTS & SOCIAL BEHAVIOR INSTRUCTION

- School personnel
   use additional
   assessments such
   as rating scales,
   observations, or
   interviews
- > Teacher practices modified to meet student needs
- > Small group & individualized behavior supports are provided to improve students' behavior & social skills
- Regular communication with parents

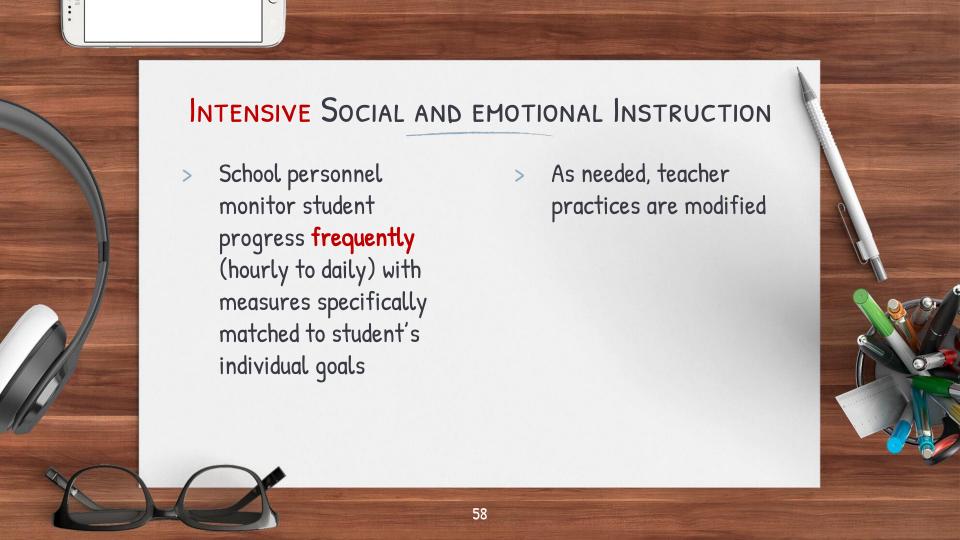
#### INTENSIVE SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL INSTRUCTION

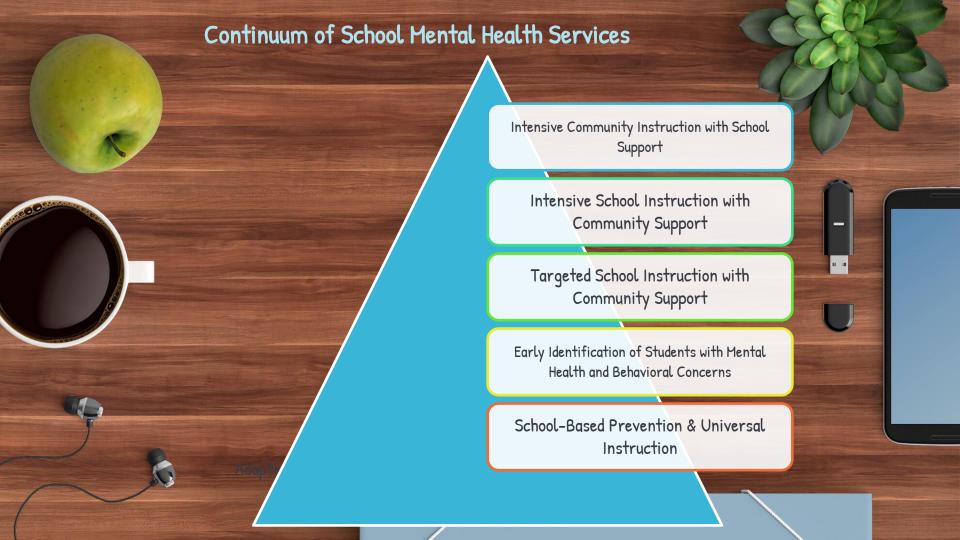
#### INTERVENTION CONSIDERATIONS

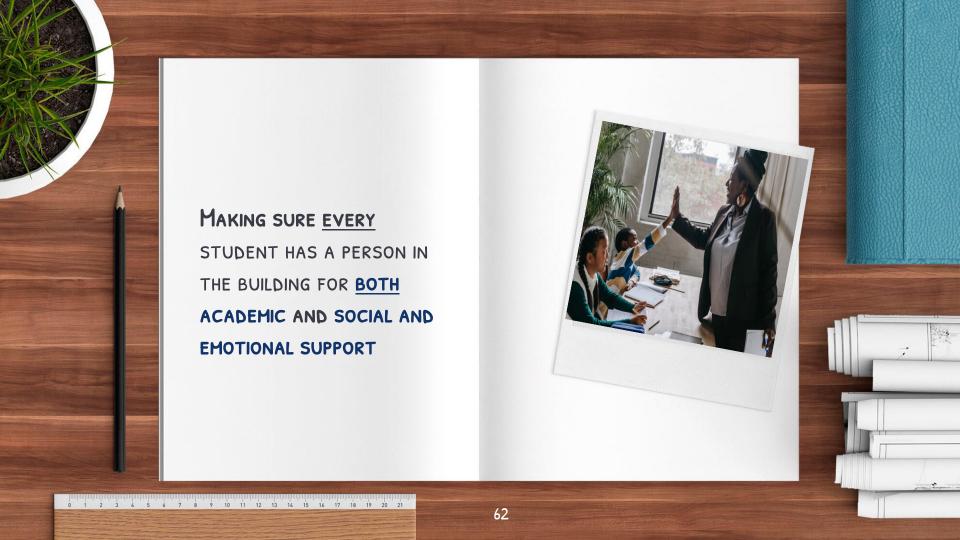
- > Interventions should be:
  - Linked to functional assessment/problem analysis results
  - Planned before they are executed
  - Acceptable and realistic
  - Produce meaningful results
  - Be taught to educators and students <u>before</u> implementation

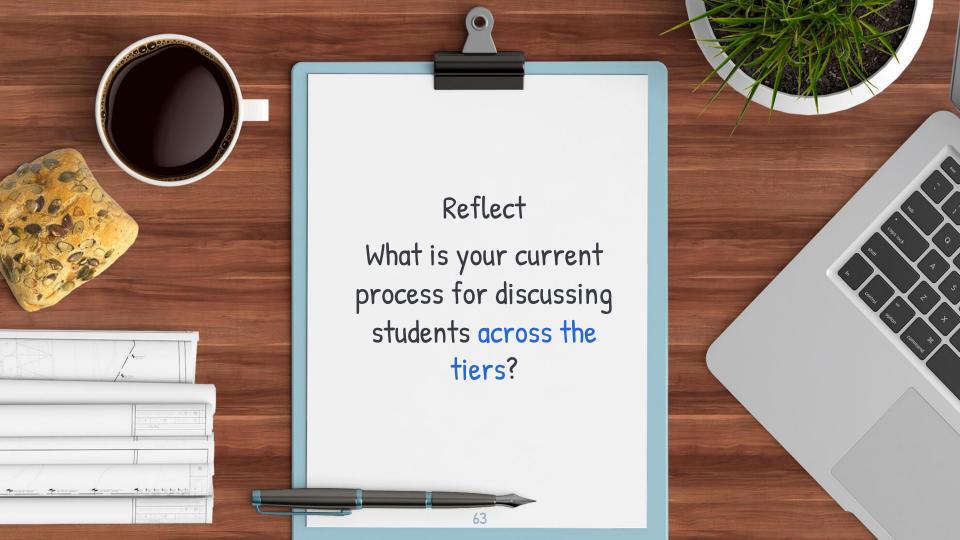


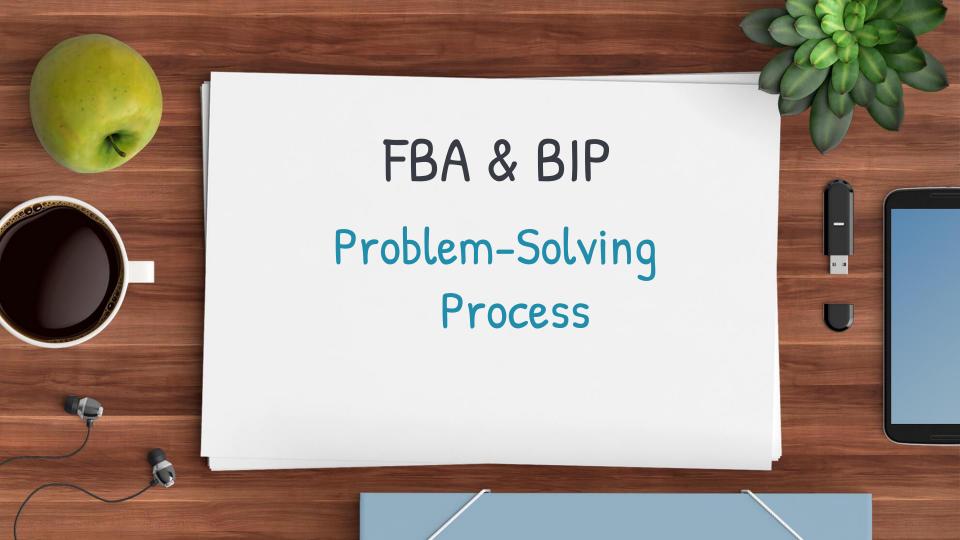
#### INTERVENTION CONSIDERATIONS

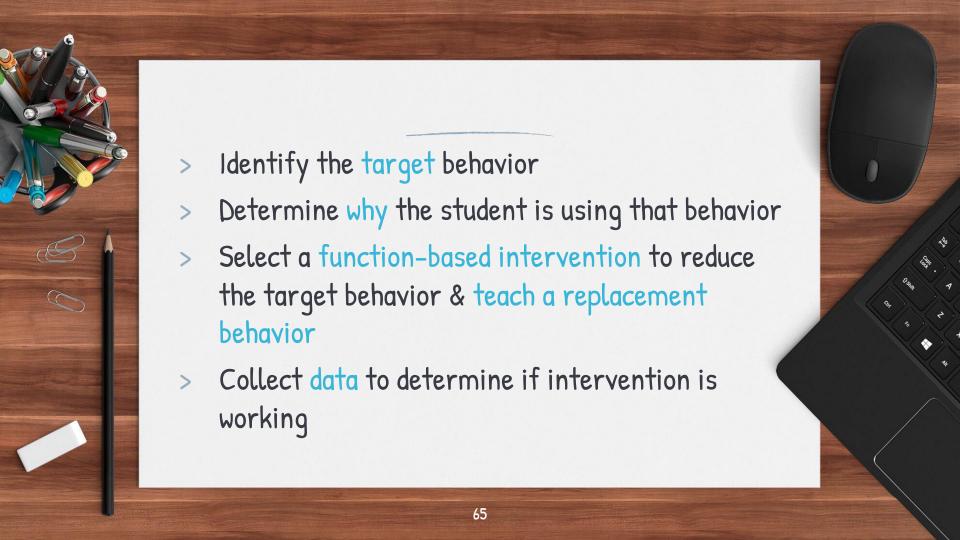
- > Be implemented with integrity and intensity
- > Be useful for other students whenever possible
- > Focus on changing behaviors not treating diagnostic labels, categories, or conditions
- Follows a Response to Instruction Model & Prevention oriented
- > Be delivered in the least restrictive environment and setting of origin











# FBA INVOLVES INDIRECT & DIRECT METHODS

# Indirect

- > Structured Interviews with teachers, parents, caregivers, & student
- > Rating scales
- > Checklists
- > Questionnaires
- > Record & Data Reviews

## Direct

- Antecedent Behavior Consequence recording
- > Scatter plots
- Observing the problem behavior(s) in natural environment



# ABC DATA

#### Antecedent

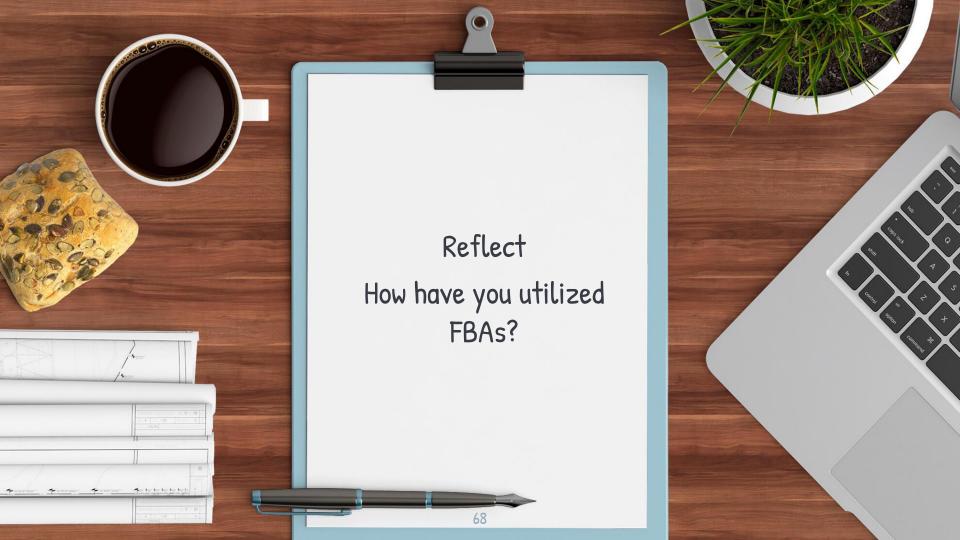
- Activity/event occurring before the behavior
- > Example : Time for Alyssa to work

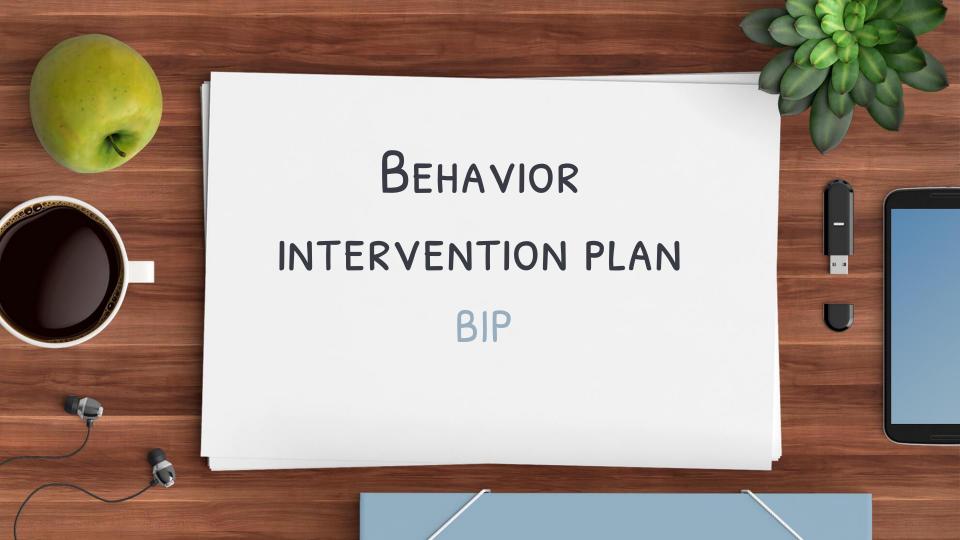
#### Behavior

- > The action or the reaction of the person
- Example: Alyssa begins throwing materials

#### Consequences

- > Events that typically follow the behavior
- > Example: Teacher removes Alyssa's work materials







# BIP DEVELOPMENT

- > Develop clear & measurable definition of target behavior
- Identify & plan for teaching more acceptable replacement behaviors that serve the same function of target behavior
- > Determine antecedent & setting events that lessen the likelihood of the target behavior
  - Curriculum and/or instructional strategies
